1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO CHANGE SEVERAL LAWS AFFECTING WAKE COUNTY.
3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. Chapter 279 of the 1989 Session Laws of North Carolina is
5 repealed.

6 Section 2. G.S. 62A-8 reads as rewritten:

7 **"§ 62A-8. Payments from Fund.**

8 (a) Money from the Emergency Telephone System Fund shall be used only to pay
9 for:

10 (1) The lease, purchase, or maintenance of emergency telephone equipment,
11 including necessary computer hardware, software and database
12 provisioning, addressing, and nonrecurring costs of establishing a 911
13 system, and

14 (2) The rates associated with the service supplier's 911 service and other
15 service supplier recurring charges.

16 (3) The purchase of mobile or portable communications equipment.

17 (b) The following expenses are not eligible for payment from the Fund: the lease
18 or purchase of real estate, cosmetic remodeling of emergency dispatch centers, hiring,

1 training, and compensating dispatchers, and the purchase of ~~mobile communications~~
2 ~~vehicles~~, ambulances, fire engines, or other emergency vehicles.

3 (c) A local government may contract with a service supplier for any term
4 negotiated by the service supplier and the local government and may make payments
5 from the Emergency Telephone System Fund to provide any payments required by the
6 contract."

7 Section 3. G.S.90-95.3(b) reads as rewritten:

8 "(b) When any person is convicted of an offense under this Article, the court may
9 order him to make restitution in the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to the State of
10 North Carolina or to a unit of local government for the expense of analyzing any
11 controlled substance possessed by him or his agent as part of an investigation leading to
12 his conviction. Any funds received under this subsection shall be deposited in the
13 General Fund—Fund, or with a unit of local government if it provided the controlled
14 substance analysis."

15 Section 4. Section 4 of Chapter 441 of the 1995 Session Laws reads as
16 rewritten:

17 "**Sec. 4.** This act is effective upon ratification. ~~This act shall sunset July 1, 1997.~~"

18 Section 5. This act applies only to Wake County.

19 Section 6. Any process served pursuant to Chapter 441 of the 1995 Session
20 Laws from July 1, 1997, until the date this act becomes law is validated by this act.

21 Section 7. Section 4 of this act is effective retroactively from July 1, 1997. The
22 remaining sections of this act become effective when they become law.
