



1 weapon any wild animal or wild bird on, from, or across the right-of-way of any public  
2 road, street, highway, or thoroughfare.

3 Section 3. It is unlawful to discharge a firearm from, onto, across, or down the  
4 right-of-way of any public road, street, highway, or thoroughfare.

5 Section 4. It is unlawful for any person to possess a loaded firearm on the land  
6 of another while under the influence of an impairing substance. For purposes of this  
7 section, a person is under the influence of an impairing substance when the person has  
8 consumed a sufficient quantity of any impairing substance to cause the person to lose the  
9 normal control of the person's bodily or mental faculties, or both, to such an extent that  
10 there is an appreciable impairment of either or both of these faculties.

11 Section 4.1. Nothing in this act prohibits a person from entering upon the  
12 right-of-way of a public road, street, highway, or thoroughfare for the sole purpose of  
13 retrieving hunting dogs or retrieving game that has fallen onto the right-of-way as a result  
14 of the person's hunting activity.

15 Section 5. Violation of this act is a Class 3 misdemeanor.

16 Section 6. This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the Wildlife  
17 Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, and by other peace officers with  
18 general subject matter jurisdiction.

19 Section 7. This act applies only to Lee County.

20 Section 8. This act becomes effective October 1, 1998.
