2 **AN ACT TO APPOINT PERSONS TO VARIOUS PUBLIC OFFICES UPON THE**  
3 **RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE**  
4 **AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND TO MAKE**  
5 **RELATED STATUTORY CHANGES CONCERNING THEIR APPOINTMENTS.**

Whereas, G.S. 120-121 authorizes the General Assembly to make certain appointments to public offices upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

Whereas, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives have made recommendations; Now, therefore,

#### 6 STATE BUILDING COMMISSION

7 Section 85. G.S. 143-135.25(c) reads as rewritten:

8 "(c) The Commission shall consist of nine members qualified and appointed as  
9 follows:

- 10 (1) A licensed architect whose primary practice is or was in the design of  
11 buildings, chosen from among not more than three persons nominated  
12 by the North Carolina Chapter of the American Institute of Architects,  
13 appointed by the Governor.
- 14 (2) A registered engineer whose primary practice is or was in the design of  
15 engineering systems for buildings, chosen from among not more than  
16 three persons nominated by the Consulting Engineers Council and the  
17 Professional Engineers of North Carolina, appointed by the General  
18 Assembly upon the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of  
19 the Senate in accordance with G.S. 120-121.
- 20 (3) A licensed building contractor whose primary business is or was in the  
21 construction of buildings, or an employee of a company holding a  
22 general contractor's license, chosen from among not more than three  
23 persons nominated by the Carolinas AGC (Associated General  
24 Contractors), appointed by the General Assembly upon the  
25 recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in  
26 accordance with G.S. 120-121.
- 27 (4) A licensed electrical contractor whose primary business is or was in the  
28 installation of electrical systems for buildings, chosen from among not  
29 more than three persons nominated by the North Carolina Association  
30 of Electrical Contractors, and the Carolinas Electrical Contractors'  
31 Association, appointed by the Governor.
- 32 (5) A public member appointed by the General Assembly upon the  
33 recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in  
34 accordance with G.S. 120-121.
- 35 (6) A licensed mechanical contractor whose primary business is or was in  
36 the installation of mechanical systems for buildings, chosen from among  
37 not more than three persons nominated by the North Carolina  
38 Association of Plumbing, Heating, Cooling Contractors, appointed by  
39 the General Assembly upon the recommendation of the Speaker of the  
40 House of Representatives in accordance with G.S. 120-121.
- 41 (7) An employee of the university system currently involved in the capital  
42 facilities development process, chosen from among not more than three



1 persons nominated by the Board of Governors of The University of  
2 North Carolina, appointed by the Governor.

3 (8) A public member who is knowledgeable in the building construction or  
4 building maintenance area, appointed by the General Assembly upon  
5 the recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate in  
6 accordance with G.S. 120-121.

7 (9) ~~A manager of physical plant operations whose responsibilities are or~~  
8 ~~were in the operations and maintenance of physical facilities, chosen~~  
9 ~~from among not more than three persons nominated by the North~~  
10 ~~Carolina Association of Physical Plant Administrators, A representative~~  
11 ~~of local government, chosen from among not more than two persons~~  
12 ~~nominated by the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners~~  
13 ~~and two persons nominated by the North Carolina League of~~  
14 ~~Municipalities, appointed by the General Assembly upon~~  
15 ~~recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives in~~  
16 ~~accordance with G.S. 120-121.~~

17 The members shall be appointed for staggered three-year terms: The initial  
18 appointments to the Commission shall be made within 15 days of the effective date of  
19 this act [April 14, 1987]. The initial terms of members appointed pursuant to subdivisions  
20 (1), (2), and (3) shall expire June 30, 1990; the initial terms of members appointed  
21 pursuant to (4), (5), and (6) shall expire June 30, 1989; and the initial terms of members  
22 appointed pursuant to (7), (8), and (9) shall expire June 30, 1988. Members may serve no  
23 more than six consecutive years. In making new appointments or filling vacancies, the  
24 Governor shall ensure that minorities and women are represented on the Commission.

25 Vacancies in appointments made by the Governor shall be filled by the Governor for  
26 the remainder of the unexpired terms. Vacancies in appointments made by the General  
27 Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Persons appointed to fill  
28 vacancies shall qualify in the same manner as persons appointed for full terms.

29 The chairman of the Commission shall be elected by the Commission. The Secretary  
30 of State shall serve as chairman until a chairman is elected."

### 31 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSIONS

32 Section 86. Article 2 of Chapter 158 of the General Statutes is amended by  
33 adding a new section to read:

#### 34 "§ 158-8.4. Removal of commission members.

35 A commission created under G.S. 158-8.1, 158-8.2, or 158-8.3 may, by majority vote,  
36 remove a member of the commission if that member does not attend at least eighty  
37 percent (80%) of the regularly scheduled meetings of the commission during any full  
38 year of service of that member on the board, except that absences excused by the  
39 commission due to serious medical or family circumstances shall not be considered. If  
40 the commission votes to remove a member under this section, the vacancy will be filled  
41 in the same manner as the original appointment."

17 (7) The President of the Travel Council of North Carolina.  
18 (8) A member designated by the Board of Directors of the Travel Council  
19 of North Carolina.  
20 (9) The President of North Carolina Citizens for Business and Industry.  
21 (10) One member designated by the North Carolina Petroleum Marketers  
22 Association.  
23 (11) One person associated with tourism attractions in North Carolina,  
24 appointed by ~~the General Assembly, upon recommendation of the~~ Speaker  
25 of the House of Representatives. One person who is not a member of the  
26 General Assembly, appointed by the Speaker of the House of  
27 Representatives.  
28 (12) One person associated with the tourism-related transportation industry,

8 ~~eight-10~~ members to be appointed by the General Assembly, ~~four-five~~ upon the  
9 recommendation of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and ~~four-five~~ upon the  
10 recommendation of the Speaker of the House of Representatives. These appointments  
11 shall be made in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and vacancies in these appointments  
12 shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Except as provided in subsection (b) of  
13 this section, all appointees shall serve two-year terms."

14 (b) G.S. 143B-30.1(c) reads as rewritten:

15 "(c) Any appointment to fill a vacancy on the Commission created by the  
16 resignation, dismissal, ineligibility, death, or disability of any member shall be for the  
17 balance of the unexpired term. The chairman shall be elected by the Commission, and he  
18 shall designate the times and places at which the Commission shall meet. The  
19 Commission shall meet at least once a month. A quorum of the Commission shall consist  
20 of ~~five-six~~ members of the Commission. The Commission is an independent agency under  
21 Article III, Section 11 of the Constitution."

22 (c) Initial appointments authorized by this section are for terms expiring June

### 24 JOINT LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

25 Section 91. (a) G.S. 120-70.80 reads as rewritten:

26 "**§ 120-70.80. Creation and membership of Joint Legislative Education Committee.**

27 The Joint Legislative Education Committee is established. The Committee consists of  
28 ~~16-18~~ members as follows:

29 (1) ~~Eight-Nine~~ members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro  
30 Tempore of the Senate, at least two of whom are members of the  
31 minority party; and

32 (2) ~~Eight-Nine~~ members of the House of Representatives appointed by the  
33 Speaker of the House of Representatives, at least three of whom are  
34 members of the minority party.

35 Terms on the Committee are for two years and begin on the convening of the General  
36 Assembly in each odd-numbered year, except the terms of the initial members, which  
37 begin on appointment and end on the day of the convening of the 1991 General  
38 Assembly. Members may complete a term of service on the Committee even if they do  
39 not seek reelection or are not reelected to the General Assembly, but resignation or  
40 removal from service in the General Assembly constitutes resignation or removal from  
41 service on the Committee.

42 A member continues to serve until his successor is appointed. A vacancy shall be  
43 filled within 30 days by the officer who made the original appointment."

1 (b) G.S. 120-70.82(b) reads as rewritten:

2 "(b) A quorum of the Committee is ~~nine~~10 members. No action may be taken  
3 except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present. While in the  
4 discharge of its official duties, the Committee has the powers of a joint committee under  
5 G.S. 120-19 and G.S. 120-19.1 through G.S. 120-19.4."

6 (c) The additional appointments authorized by this section are for terms  
7 expiring on convening of the 1999 General Assembly.

#### 8 **JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS**

9 Section 92. G.S. 120-74 reads as rewritten:

10 "**§ 120-74. Appointment of members; terms of office.**

11 The Commission shall consist of ~~26~~30 members. The President pro tempore of the  
12 Senate, the Speaker pro tempore of the House, and the Majority Leader of the Senate and  
13 the Speaker of the House shall serve as ex officio members of the Commission. The  
14 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint ~~eleven~~13 members from the  
15 House. The President pro tempore of the Senate shall appoint ~~eleven~~13 members from  
16 the Senate. Vacancies created by resignation or otherwise shall be filled by the original  
17 appointing authority. Members shall serve two-year terms beginning and ending on  
18 January 15 of the odd-numbered years, except that initial appointments shall begin on  
19 July 1, 1975. Members shall not be disqualified from completing a term of service on the  
20 Commission because they fail to run or are defeated for reelection. Resignation or  
21 removal from the General Assembly shall constitute resignation or removal from  
22 membership on the Commission. The terms of the initial members of the Commission  
23 shall expire January 15, 1977."

24 Section 93. Unless otherwise specified, all appointments made by this act are  
25 for terms to begin when this act becomes law.

26 Section 94. This act is effective when it becomes law. ♦
