| 3 | Whereas, the month of July is celebrated as National Ice Cream Month and the third |
| 4 | Sunday in July is celebrated as National Ice Cream Day; and |
| 5 | Whereas, ice cream is consumed by approximately 90% of the population in the |
| 6 | United States; and |
| 7 | Whereas, according to recent data, ice cream contributes about \$39 billion to the |
| 8 | United States' economy and produces almost 188,000 jobs; and |
| 9 | Whereas, ice cream can be combined with other foods such as fruit and sauces to |
| 10 | create a variety of other treats; and |
| 11 | Whereas, ice cream is important to the North Carolina dairy industry and is locally |
| 12 | produced all across the State by dairy farmers, creameries, family-owned businesses, and North |
| 13 | Carolina State University; and |
| 14 | Whereas, North Carolina does not have an official frozen treat; Now, therefore, |
| 15 | The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: |
| 16 | SECTION 1. Chapter 145 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new |
| 17 | section to read: |
| 18 | " <u>§ 145-52. State frozen treat.</u> |
| 19 | Ice cream is adopted as the official frozen treat of the State of North Carolina." |
| 20 | SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. |
