- Aggravated Death by Distribution of Certain Controlled Substances. A person is 1 (c) 2 guilty of aggravated death by distribution of certain controlled substances if all of the following 3 requirements are met: 4 The person unlawfully sells at least one certain controlled substance. (1) 5 **(2)** The ingestion of the certain controlled substance or substances causes the 6 death of the user. 7 The commission of the offense in subdivision (1) of this subsection was the <u>(3)</u> 8 proximate cause of the victim's death. 9 The person did not act with malice. <u>(4)</u> 10 The person has a previous conviction under this section, G.S. 90-95(a)(1), (5) 11 90-95.1, 90-95.4, 90-95.6, or trafficking in violation of G.S. 90-95(h), or a 12 prior conviction in any federal or state court in the United States that is 13 substantially similar to an offense listed, within seven years of the date of the 14 offense. In calculating the seven-year period under this subdivision, any 15 period of time during which the person was incarcerated in a local, state, or 16 federal detention center, jail, or prison shall be excluded. 17 Certain Controlled Substance. – For the purposes of this section, the term "certain controlled substance" includes any opium, opiate, or opioid; any synthetic or natural salt, 18 19 compound, derivative, or preparation of opium, opiate, or opioid; cocaine or any other substance 20 described in G.S. 90-90(1)(d); methamphetamine; a depressant described in G.S. 90-92(a)(1); or 21 a mixture of one or more of these substances. 22 Lesser Included Offense. – Death by distribution of certain controlled substances 23 constitutes a lesser included offense of aggravated death by distribution of certain controlled 24 substances in violation of this section. 25 Samaritan Protection. - Nothing in this section shall be construed to restrict or 26 interfere with the rights and immunities provided under G.S. 90-96.2. 27 Lawful Distribution. – This section shall not apply to any of the following: (g) 28 <u>(1)</u> <u>Issuing a valid prescription for a controlled substance for a legitimate medical</u> 29 purpose by an individual practitioner acting in the usual course of professional 30 practice. 31 Dispensing, delivering, or administering a controlled substance pursuant to a <u>(2)</u> prescription, by a pharmacy permitted under G.S. 90-85.21, a pharmacist, or

Penalties. - Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law (h) providing greater punishment, the following classifications apply to the offenses set forth in this section:

an individual practitioner.

- Death by distribution of certain controlled substances is a Class C felony. <u>(1)</u>
- Aggravated death by distribution of certain controlled substances is a Class **(2)** B2 felony."
- **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2019, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
