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Sponsors: Referred to: April 4, 2019 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO SIMPLIFY THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM, CLARIFY ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS TO APPLY TO CERTAIN FOUR YEAR OLDS, AND MAKE VARIOUS OTHER CHANGES TO THE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: PART I. SPECIAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CHILDREN WITH **DISABILITIES SECTION 1.1.** G.S. 115C-112.5(2) reads as rewritten: Eligible student. – A child under the age of 22 who resides in North Carolina and meets all of the following criteria: Is a child with a disability. a. Is eligible to attend a North Carolina public school pursuant to b. G.S. 115C-366. Article 25 of this Chapter. A child who is the age of four on or before April 16 is eligible to attend the following school year if the principal, or equivalent, of the school in which the child seeks to enroll finds that the student meets the requirements of G.S. 115C-364(d) and those findings are submitted to the Authority with the child's application. Has not been placed in a nonpublic school or facility by a public c.

- d. Has not been enrolled in a postsecondary institution as a full-time student taking at least 12 hours of academic credit.
- e. Has not received a high school diploma.

 - 1. Was enrolled in a North Carolina public school or a Department of Defense Elementary and Secondary School, established pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 2164 and located in North Carolina, during the spring semester prior to the school year for which the student is applying. PART II. OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM

SECTION 2.1. G.S. 115C-562.1(3) reads as rewritten:

- "(3) Eligible students. A student residing in North Carolina who has not yet received a high school diploma and who meets all of the following requirements:
 - a. Meets one of the following criteria:
 - 1. Was a full-time student (i) assigned to and attending a public school pursuant to G.S. 115C-366 or (ii) enrolled in a Department of Defense Elementary and Secondary School, established pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 2164 and located in North Carolina, during the spring semester prior to the school year for which the student is applying.
 - 2. Received a scholarship grant for the school year prior to the school year for which the student is applying.
 - 3. Is entering eligible to enter either kindergarten or the first grade.grade pursuant to Article 25 of this Chapter. A child who is the age of four on or before April 16 is eligible to attend the following school year if the principal, or equivalent, of the school in which the child seeks to enroll finds that the student meets the requirements of G.S. 115C-364(d) and those findings are submitted to the Authority with the child's application.
 - 4. Is a child in foster care as defined in G.S. 131D-10.2(9).
 - 5. Is a child whose adoption decree was entered not more than one year prior to submission of the scholarship grant application.
 - 6. Is a child whose parent or legal guardian is on full-time duty status in the active uniformed service of the United States, including members of the National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 12301, et seq., and 10 U.S.C. § 12401, et seq.
 - a1. Has not enrolled in a postsecondary institution in a matriculated status eligible for enrollment for 12 hours of academic credit.
 - b. Resides in a household with an income level not in excess of one hundred thirty-three percent (133%) one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the amount required for the student to qualify for the federal free or reduced-price lunch program. The Authority shall not count any distribution from the estate of a decedent in calculating the income level of the applicant's household for the purposes of determining eligibility for a scholarship under this sub-subdivision."

SECTION 2.2. G.S. 115C-562.2(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) The Authority shall make available no later than February 1 annually applications to eligible students for the award of scholarship grants to attend any nonpublic school. Information about scholarship grants and the application process shall be made available on the Authority's Web site. Beginning March 15, the Authority shall begin awarding scholarship grants according to the following criteria:

 - Has not enrolled in a postsecondary institution in a matriculated status eligible for enrollment for 12 hours of academic credit.
 - Is a child with a disability, as defined in G.S. 115C-106.3(1), including, for example, intellectual disability, hearing impairment, speech or language impairment, visual impairment, serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, other health impairments, specific learning disability, or disability as may be required to be included under IDEA.
 - d. Has not been placed in a nonpublic school or facility by a public agency at public expense."

PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the award of scholarship funds for the 2020-2021 school year.

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
