1	A HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO OPPOSE THE SECURITIES AND	
2	EXCHANGE COMMISSION'S PROPOSED RULE ON "THE ENHANCEMENT AND	
3	STANDARDIZATION OF CLIMATE-RELATED DISCLOSURES FOR INVESTORS"	
4	AS IT RELATES TO AGRICULTURE.	
5	Whereas, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) has proposed a rule on	
6	"The Enhancement and Standardization of Climate-related Disclosures for Investors," which	
7	includes a requirement that public companies disclose their Scope 3 greenhouse gas emissions.	
8	This requirement would become de facto regulation of all farms by the SEC and would require	
9	farms of all si	zes to disclose a significant amount of information on climate-related items that
10	they very well	may be currently unable to quantify; and
11	Whereas, this rule would impact the State's agriculture industry significantly; and	
12	Whereas, agriculture contributes 92.9 billion dollars to our State's economy annually,	
13	making it the State's number one industry; and	
14		nereas, farmgate sales provide nearly a tenth of this total, with robust
15		, wholesale, and retail operations accounting for the remainder; and
16		hereas, in North Carolina, 98% of farms are family owned and operated.
17	•	of the 46,000 farms in our State, nearly 80% have revenues of \$50,000 or less.
18	These farms are not corporations with sophisticated compliance departments with dedicated	
19	staffing resources like you would find in a publicly traded company, nor should they be treated	
20	as such. Imposing additional reporting requirements around climate-related metrics would	
21		of all sizes from their focus on producing food, fiber, and fuel; and
22		hereas, given the challenges currently facing the farm economy from inflation and
23		enses, this additional regulatory burden could cause family farms to cease
24	operations; and	
25		nereas, with the strong potential for food shortages in the near future, now is not
