

Short Title: (Public) Remote Academies. Representative Elmore. Sponsors: Referred to: 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE USE OF REMOTE ACADEMIES BY LOCAL SCHOOL 3 ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5 **SECTION 1.** Article 16 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by 6 adding a new Part to read: 7 "Part 3A. Remote Academies. 8 "§ 115C-234. Remote academies. 9 A local board of education may apply to the State Board of Education for approval of (a) 10 remote academies that meets the requirements of this Part. The State Board of Education shall 11 limit total enrollment in all remote academies granted to the local school administrative unit to 12 no more than ten percent (10%) of the total student enrollment of that unit. The State Board shall 13 grant no more than the following numbers of remote academies per local school administrative 14 unit, based on student enrollment at the time of application: 15 One remote academy for local school administrative units with 15,000 or (1)16 fewer students. 17 Two remote academies for local school administrative units with between (2)15,001 and 30,000 students. 18 19 (3) Three remote academies for local school administrative units with between 30,001 and 50,000 students. 20 21 Four remote academies for local school administrative units with between (4) 22 50,001 and 100,000 students. 23 Five remote academies for local school administrative units with more than (5) 24 100,000 students. 25 A remote academy is a public school that provides a majority of instructional hours (b) through remote instruction to all students enrolled in the school. Remote instruction is instruction 26 27 that primarily uses technology to deliver instructional content over the internet to students in a 28 remote location both synchronously and asynchronously. A local board of education shall not provide the majority of instructional hours 29 (c) through remote instruction in a school except as provided in this Part. 30 31 "§ 115C-234.5. Remote academy requirements. Except as provided in this Part, a remote academy shall meet all requirements for a 32 (a) public school included in this Chapter.

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1	Part. A remote academy shall be approved for a period of five school years, and may be renewed
2	for additional five-year terms, upon resubmission of an application.
3	(c) The State Board may revoke approval of a remote academy at any time on the basis
4	of substantial noncompliance with the requirements of this Part or the approved plan.

6	(a) Each approved remote academy shall adhere to the plan submitted to and approved
7	by the State Board of Education unless the local school administrative unit obtains in writing
8	approval for plan modifications from the State Board of Education.
9	(b) Each approved remote academy shall receive a school code and shall be assigned a
10	principal for that school.
11	" <u>§ 115C-234.20. Evaluation.</u>
12	The State Board of Education shall evaluate the success of remote academies approved under
13	this Part. Success shall be measured by school performance scores and grades, retention rates,
14	attendance rates, and for grades nine through 12, high school completion and dropout rates. The
15	Board shall report by November 15 of each year to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight
16	Committee on the evaluation of these schools and on any recommended statutory changes."
17	SECTION 2. The State Board of Education shall adopt emergency rules for the
18	implementation of Part 3A of Article 16 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes, as enacted by
19	this act, for use in the 2021-2022 school year only, in accordance with G.S. 150B-21.1A.
20	SECTION 3. The State Board of Education shall make the first evaluation report
21	required by G.S. 115C-234.20, as enacted by this act, by November 15, 2022.
22	SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with
23	the 2021-2022 school year.
