Five members of the Senate, appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the 38 (11)39 Senate, one of whom shall be a public member. 40 Five members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of (12)41 the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be a public member. 42 In making appointments or designating representatives, appointing authorities shall use best 43 44

efforts to select members or representatives with sufficient knowledge and experience to effectively contribute to the duties of the Task Force and, to the extent possible, to reflect the geographical, political, gender, and racial diversity of this State.

- Meetings and Quorum. The Task Force shall meet quarterly and at other times at the call of the chair. A majority of voting members of the Task Force shall constitute a quorum.
- Voting, Terms, and Vacancies. All members of the Task Force are voting members. Vacancies in the appointed membership shall be filled by the appointing officer who made the initial appointment. Terms shall be for a period of two years. The members shall elect a chair, who shall preside for the duration of the chair's term as a member. In the event a vacancy occurs

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in the chair before the expiration of the chair's term, the members shall elect an acting chair to
 serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.
 (e) Authorization to Hire Staff and Consultants; Funding. – The Task Force may use

- (e) <u>Authorization to Hire Staff and Consultants; Funding. The Task Force may use funds allocated to it to hire staff or contract with consultants and other professionals to assist the Task Force in the completion of its duties.</u>
- (f) Compensation. Members of the Task Force, staff, and consultants shall receive necessary travel and subsistence expenses while on official business of the Task Force in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5 or G.S. 138-6, as applicable, paid from funds allocated to support the work of the Task Force and within the limits of those funds."

**SECTION 3.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of one hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$155,000) in recurring funds to support the work and cover the expenses of the North Carolina Trauma Prevention Task Force created in Section 2 of this act.

**SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2022.

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
