9	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
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11	PART I. INSURANCE PROTECTIONS
12	SECTION 1.(a) G.S. 58-3-25 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
13	"(d) No insurer shall refuse to insure or to continue to insure an individual; limit the
14	amount, extent, or kind of coverage available to an individual; charge an individual a different
15	amount for the same coverage; or otherwise discriminate against an individual in the offering,
16	issuance, cancellation, price, or conditions of a policy, or in the amount of coverage provided
17	under a policy, based solely and without any additional actuarial risks on the status of an
18	individual as a living organ donor. This subsection shall apply to health benefit plans and life,
19	accident and health, disability, disability income, and long-term care insurance policies. For the
20	purposes of this subsection, the phrase "a living organ donor" shall mean a living individual who
21	donates one or more of that individual's human organs, including bone marrow, to be medically
22	transplanted into the body of another individual."
23	SECTION 1.(b) This section is effective 30 days after it becomes law and applies to
24	insurance contracts issued, renewed, or amended on or after that date.

31	(1) Human organ. – Human bone marrow or any organ of a human, including the

35	medical procedure to the body of another individual.

39	SECTION 3.(a) Article 2 of Chapter 126 of the General Statu	ites is amended by
40	adding a new section to read:	
41	"§ 126-8.6. Paid leave for State employees and State-supported per	sonnel for organ
42	donation.	
43	(a) <u>Full-Time Employees. – The State Human Resources Commission</u>	on shall adopt rules
44	and policies to provide that a permanent, full-time State employee may take	
45	other leave available to the employee, up to (i) 30 days of paid leave for the p	
46	as a living organ donor and (ii) seven days for serving as a bone marrow do	
47	must have been continuously employed by the State for at least 12 months imm	nediately preceding
48	the first request for paid organ or bone marrow donation leave.	
49	(b) Part-Time Employees. – The State Human Resources Commission	-
50	and policies to provide that a permanent, part-time State employee may take	
51	other leave available to the employee, a prorated amount of up to (i) 30 days of	of paid leave for the

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1	purposes of serving as a living organ donor and (ii) seven days for serving as a bone marrow
2	donor. The employee must have been continuously employed by the State for at least 12 months
3	immediately preceding the first request for paid organ or bone marrow donation leave.
4	(c) Program Requirements. – The paid leave for organ or bone marrow donation
5	authorized by this section:
6	(1) Is available without exhaustion of the employee's sick and vacation leave.
7	(2) Is in addition to, and not in lieu of, shared leave under G.S. 126-8.3, or other
8	leave authorized by federal or State law.
9	(3) May not be used for retirement purposes.
10	(4) Has no cash value upon termination from employment.
11	(d) <u>Applicability. – This section applies to all (i) State employees and (ii) State-supported</u>
12	personnel, with the appropriate governing board adopting rules and policies to provide paid leave
13	for organ donation to its employees as provided by this section.
14	(e) <u>Reporting. – By April 1, 2024, and then annually thereafter, the State Human</u>
15	Resources Commission, the State Board of Education, the State Board of Community Colleges,
16	and all State agencies, departments, and institutions shall annually report to the Office of State
17	Human Resources on the paid organ donation leave program."
18	SECTION 3.(b) G.S. 126-5 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
19	"(c19) The provisions of G.S. 126-8.6 shall apply to all State employees, public school
20	employees, and community college employees."
