Short Title: Criminal Falsification of Medical Records. (Public) Sponsors: Referred to: March 8, 2023 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CREATE THE OFFENSE OF WILLFUL DESTRUCTION, ALTERATION, OR FALSIFICATION OF MEDICAL RECORDS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Article 29 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 90-413. Willful destruction, alteration, or falsification of medical records. Offense. – It is unlawful for a health care provider to knowingly and willfully destroy, alter, or falsify a medical record, or to direct any person to knowingly destroy, alter, or falsify a medical record, for any of the following purposes: Concealing the commission of an error by the health care provider in (1) providing medical services that caused injury to or the death of a patient. Unlawfully obtaining money or any other thing of value. (2) Concealing any material fact not covered under subdivision (1) of this (3) subsection relating to a potential claim or cause of action. Punishment. – Unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, violations of subsection (a) of this section are punishable as follows: A violation of subdivision (1) of subsection (a) of this section is a Class H (1) felony. (2) A violation of subdivision (2) of subsection (a) of this section is a Class I felony. A violation of subdivision (3) of subsection (a) of this section is a Class A1 (3) misdemeanor. Civil Remedies. – Nothing in this section shall affect any civil remedies available for actions punishable under this section." **SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses

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committed on or after that date.
