Prohibited acts; penalties. 9 It shall be unlawful for any person: (a) 10 11 (12)To make, distribute, or possess any punch, die, plate, stone, or other thing 12 designed to print, imprint, or reproduce the trademark, trade name, or other identifying mark, imprint, or device of another or any likeness of any of the 13 14 foregoing upon any drug or container or labeling thereof so as to render such 15 drug a counterfeit controlled substance. 16 (12a) To possess any three-neck round-bottom flask, tableting machine, 17 encapsulating machine, or gelatin capsule, or any equipment, chemical, product, or material which may be used to manufacture a controlled substance 18 19 or listed chemical, knowing, intending, or having reasonable cause to believe that it will be used to manufacture a counterfeit controlled substance. 20 21 (12b) To manufacture, distribute, export, or import any three-neck round-bottom flask, tableting machine, encapsulating machine, or gelatin capsule, or any 22 23 equipment, chemical, product, or material which may be used to manufacture 24 a controlled substance or listed chemical, knowing, intending, or having 25 reasonable cause to believe that it will be used to manufacture a counterfeit controlled substance. 26 27 28 Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor. Provided, that if the criminal pleading alleges that the violation was committed intentionally, and 29 upon trial it is specifically found that the violation was committed intentionally, such violations 30 31 shall be a Class I felony unless one of the following applies: 32 33 A person who violates subdivision (12a) or (12b) of subsection (a) of this (1a) 34 section shall be punished as a Class D felon. '' 35



SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.

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
