Short Title: (Public) Unfair Advertising/Food Delivery Platforms. Representative White. Sponsors: Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT PROHIBITING UNFAIR AND DECEPTIVE ADVERTISING BY FOOD DELIVERY PLATFORMS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: **SECTION 1.** Article 1 of Chapter 75 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 75-44. Unfair and deceptive trade practices by food delivery platforms. The following definitions apply in this section: (a) Establishment. – As defined in G.S. 130A-247. (1) Food delivery platform. – An online business that acts as an intermediary (2) between consumers and multiple establishments by submitting food orders to the eating establishment and arranging for the delivery of the order from the eating establishment to consumers. A food delivery platform must obtain express written authorization from an establishment, or the establishment's agent, before doing any of the following: Advertising, directly or indirectly, any statement or image that implies an (1) establishment has partnered with the food delivery platform. Using a likeness, trademark, or other intellectual property belonging to an (2) establishment. Arranging for the delivery of a food order from an establishment. (3) An establishment, or the establishment's agent, may revoke authorization under this section by notifying the food delivery platform in writing. If a food delivery platform violates this section, the establishment whose express written authorization was required may bring any of the following actions in civil court: An action to enjoin further violations of this section by the food delivery (1) platform. An action to recover treble damages pursuant to G.S. 75-16. The damages (2) trebled in a civil action brought pursuant to this subdivision shall equal the greater of the following: The establishment's actual damages arising from the violation. a. The food delivery platform's profits arising from the violation.



A violation of this section is a violation of G.S. 75-1.1."

**SECTION 2.** This act becomes effective October 1, 2023.
