2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR PARTISAN ELECTIONS FOR THE MEMBERS OF THE
3	CATAWBA COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION, HICKORY CITY BOARD OF
4	EDUCATION, AND NEWTON-CONOVER CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	SECTION 1.(a) Section 1 of Chapter 874 of the 1969 Session Laws, as amended by
7	Chapter 170 of the 1985 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:
8	"Section 1. The Board of Education of Catawba County Board of Education shall continue
9	to be constituted with consist of seven members as its membership, and the present members of
10	the Board of Education of Catawba County shall continue to hold their offices for the terms of
11	office now established and until the term of office of each member has expired as follows:

19	SECTION 1.(b) Section 2 of Chapter 874 of the 1969 Session Laws, as amended by
20	Chapter 170 of the 1985 Session Laws and Chapter 132 of the 1995 Session Laws, reads as

22	"Sec. 2. In the general election in 1986, there shall be elected four members of the Board of
23	Education of Catawba County. In the general election in 1988, there shall be elected three
24	members of the Board of Education of Catawba County. All members so elected shall hold their
25	offices for four years, and serve until their successors are elected and qualified. Beginning in
26	1996, as vacancies occur in the membership of Seats on the Catawba County Board of Education
27	of Catawba County by reason of expiration of terms of office, they shall be filled by nomination
28	in the primaries and by election in the general elections according to the number of vacancies to
29	be filled and according to the procedure set forth in this Act."
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30 SECTION 1.(c) Section 3 of Chapter 874 of the 1969 Session Laws, as amended by 31 Chapter 382 of the 1979 Session Laws and Chapter 132 of the 1995 Session Laws, reads as 32 rewritten:

"Sec. 3. All persons desiring to be candidates for membership on said-the Catawba County
Board of Education shall file <u>a</u> notice of candidacy with the Board of Elections of Catawba
County not earlier than noon on the first Monday in June and not later than noon on the first
Friday in July in the year of the election, which at the same time as candidates for other county

One (1)-member of the Hickory City Board of Education shall be elected from each 7 ward by the qualified voters of the ward, and the member must be a resident of the ward. One (1)8 member of the Hickory City Board of Education shall be elected at large by the qualified voters 9 of the entire unit. The election shall be nonpartisan and no primary election shall be held. 10 Members shall be elected on a partisan basis, and the election shall be conducted in accordance 11 with G.S. 163-279(a)(2) and G.S. 163-291. Except as provided by this act, the election shall be conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapters 115C and 163 of the General 12 13 Statutes. The election shall be held and conducted by the Catawba County Board of Elections 14 and the expense of the election shall be paid by Catawba County. Registration and the election 15 shall be held and conducted in accordance with the laws, rules and regulations applicable to 16 elections for County offices except as otherwise provided in this act." 17 SECTION 2.(c) Section 4 of Chapter 930 of the 1971 Session Laws, as amended by 18 Chapter 382 of the 1979 Session Laws, reads as rewritten: 19 "Sec. 4. Candidates for membership on the Hickory City Board of Education shall file their 20 a notice of candidacy with the Catawba County Board of Elections, on forms prescribed by the 21 Board, not later than 5:00 p.m. on the ninth Friday preceding the election, Catawba County Board of Elections, and pay a filing fee of five dollars (\$5.00). If more than two (2) candidates file from 22 23 a ward, or as an at-large candidate, the person receiving a plurality of the votes cast shall be 24 declared elected. All candidates in any primary or general election held under this act shall be 25 qualified voters of Catawba County who reside within the boundaries of the Hickory 26 Administrative School Unit and, if filing for a seat representing a ward, reside within that ward." 27 SECTION 2.(d) Section 7 of Chapter 930 of the 1971 Session Laws reads as 28 rewritten: 29 "Sec. 7. Beginning in 1973, except as otherwise specifically provided herein elections under 30 this act shall be held on the same date as regular municipal elections in the City of Hickory for 31 the purpose of electing members to the Board of Education to take the place of the members 32 whose terms next expire. The members elected shall take office and qualify on the first Monday 33 in December following their election and shall serve for terms of four (4) years, and until their 34 successors are elected and qualified." 35 SECTION 2.(e) Section 10 of Chapter 930 of the 1971 Session Laws reads as 36 rewritten: 37 "Sec. 10. All vacancies in the membership of the Hickory City Board of Education shall be 38 filled by appointment by the remaining members of the Board. If a vacancy occurs during the 39 first two years of a term, such appointment shall be only until the next regular election for seats 40 on the Board, at which time such vacancy shall be filled by election for the remaining two years of the term. If a vacancy occurs during the last two years of a term, such appointment shall be 41 42 for the remainder of the term.in accordance with G.S. 115C-37.1. For the purposes of that section, 43 the Hickory City Board of Education shall be considered a county board of education." 44 SECTION 2.(f) Sections 5 and 6 of Chapter 930 of the 1971 Session Laws are 45 repealed. 46 SECTION 2.(g) This act does not affect the term of office of any member elected in 2019 or 2021 to the Hickory City Board of Education. The members of the Hickory City Board 47 48 of Education elected in 2019 and 2021, or any member appointed to fill a vacancy for the 49 remainder of an unexpired term for a member elected in 2019 or 2021, shall serve until a 50 successor has been elected and qualified. Any vacancy on the Hickory City Board of Education

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for a member elected in 2019 and 2021 shall be filled by appointment by the remaining members 1 2 of the Board. 3 **SECTION 2.(h)** This section is effective when it becomes law and applies to 4 elections held in 2023 and thereafter. 5 **SECTION 3.(a)** Chapter 200 of the Private Laws of 1935, as amended by Chapter 6 716 of the 1961 Session Laws and Chapter 81 of the 1967 Session Laws, reads as rewritten: 7 "Section 1. That at the next municipal election to be held on the first Monday in May, one 8 thousand nine hundred thirty-five, there shall be elected by the qualified voters residing in the 9 Newton-Conover City Administrative Unit four members to serve on the Board of Trustees of 10 said administrative unit, the election to be held under and subject to the same rules and 11 regulations governing the nominating and electing of municipal officers of the Town of Newton. 12 Said election to be held by having two voting places, one in the Town Hall in the Town of 13 Newton, and all qualified voters residing in the old Newton Graded School District, viz: within 14 the boundary lines of the Newton Graded School District as of January first, one thousand nine 15 hundred and thirty-one, shall be allowed to vote at such an election at the Newton voting precinct, 16 and the other voting precinct shall be in the school building, or in the Town hall, in the Town of 17 Conover, North Carolina, and all qualified voters residing in the old Conover Special Tax School 18 District, viz: within the boundary lines of said old Conover Special Tax School District as of 19 January first, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, shall be allowed to vote at such an 20 election at the Conover voting precinct. The Board of Trustees for said administrative unit shall 21 consist of six members, four of whom shall reside within the limits of the old Newton Graded 22 School District, and the remaining two shall reside in that territory formerly known as the 23 Conover Special Tax School District. The terms of office for said trustees shall be as follows: D. 24 B. Gaither and O. R. Cline shall continue as members of the Newton-Conover City 25 Administrative Unit until their present term of office expires on the first Monday in May, one 26 thousand nine hundred and thirty-six. Two members, one from Newton and one from Conover 27 District, shall be elected on the first Monday in May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, 28 for a term of two years. Two members, one from Newton and one from Conover District, shall 29 be elected on the first Monday in May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, for a term of 30 three years. On the first Monday in May in each year thereafter there shall be elected two trustees 31 who shall hold office for a period of three years to succeed those whose terms expire. The 32 Newton-Conover City Board of Education shall consist of six members. Members shall serve 33 staggered four-year terms. Three members shall represent the Newton district. Three members 34 shall represent the Conover district. 35 "Sec. 1¹/₂. (a) Qualified voters residing in the area hereinbefore defined as "Old Conover 36 Special School Tax District" shall vote for the Trustees-members of the Newton-Conover City 37 Board of Education residing in that district only and the qualified voters residing in the area 38 hereinbefore defined as the "Old Newton Graded School District" shall vote for the Trustees 39 members of the Newton-Conover City Board of Education residing in that district only, so that 40 the Conover representatives shall be elected exclusively by voters and residents of the Conover 41 district and the Newton representatives shall be elected exclusively by voters and residents of the 42 Newton district. At each election herein provided for, the Town of Conover shall provide a 43 separate ballot to be used in the election of Trustees of the School Unit containing the names of 44 the Conover candidates only and the City of Newton shall provide a separate ballot to be used in 45 the election of Trustees of the School Unit containing the names of the Newton candidates only. 46 For the purpose of conducting the elections herein provided for, for members of the (b) 47 Newton-Conover City Board of Education, the division and boundary line separating the said 48 Old Conover Special School Tax District and the Old Newton Graded School District is hereby 49 established and re-defined as follows:

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"Sec. 2. That the election officials of the Town of Newton, North Carolina, shall conduct said 1 2 election, appoint the registrars, judges, and other poll holders necessary, and do each and 3 everything necessary in conducting said election, under the rules governing and controlling 4 regular and special municipal elections, of the voting precinct located in the Town of Newton. 5 That the election officials of the Town of Conover, North Carolina, shall conduct the election at 6 the voting precinct in the Town of Conover in the same manner as herein provided for the Town of Newton: Provided, that any special election may be called by the election officials of said 7 8 Towns meeting in joint session. Members of the Newton-Conover City Board of Education shall 9 be elected on a partisan basis, and the election shall be conducted in accordance with G.S. 163-279(a)(2) and G.S. 163-291. Except as provided by this act, the election shall be 10 11 conducted in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapters 115C and 163 of the General 12 Statutes. 13 "Sec. 3. That a special book shall be provided in each voting place for the registration of 14 voters residing within the limits of each voting place, or precinct, as set out herein, who shall 15 register and vote in the precinct in which they reside, and special boxes shall be provided at each voting place, to wit, in the Town Hall in Newton, North Carolina, and in the school building or 16 17 Town Hall in Conover, North Carolina, in which shall be deposited the votes for said trustees: 18 Provided, that all legally qualified voters now registered in the Town of Newton or in the former 19 Newton Graded School District shall be deemed legally registered in the said Newton precinct 20 and all legally qualified voters now registered in the Town of Conover or in the old Conover Special Tax District shall be deemed legally registered in the Conover precinct, and such 21 registered voters shall not be required to re-register except and unless a new registration shall be 22 23 ordered in either or both of said precincts by the election officials of the Towns of Newton and 24 Conover meeting in joint session. All candidates in any primary or general election held under 25 this act shall be qualified voters of Catawba County who reside within the boundaries of the 26 Newton-Conover Administrative School Unit and who reside in the district for the seat 27 apportioned to that district. 28 "Sec. 4. That the said trustees Elected members of the Newton-Conover City Board of 29 Education shall take office and qualify and enter upon their duties as such officers on the first 30 Monday next in December following the election as herein provided, and shall have all the powers, authorities and duties conferred and imposed upon the trustees now acting as trustees of 31 32 the said Newton Conover City Administrative Unit and the said trustees now serving, with the 33 exception of D. B. Gaither and O. R. Cline, shall, when the four trustees herein provided for have 34 been elected and qualified, be relieved of all further duties powers and authorities as such 35 trustees.election. Members shall serve until their successors are elected and qualified. 36 "Sec. 5. That the said trustees, as herein provided for, Each year, the members of the 37 Newton-Conover City Board of Education shall at their first meeting elect from their number a 38 chairman, who shall a chair to serve for one year, and that thereafter at the first meeting after 39 each election they shall elect a chairman to serve for one year. 40 "Sec. 6. That the The expense of the election herein provided for as held in the Town of Newton shall be paid by the Town of Newton from the general funds of said the Town. That the 41 42 The expense of the election herein provided for as held in the Town of Conover shall be paid by 43 the Town of Conover from the general funds of said-the Town. 44 "Sec. 7. That vacancies occurring Vacancies on the Newton-Conover City Board of trustees Education shall be filled by appointments made by the remaining members of said Board at the 45 46 time of such vacancy.in accordance with G.S. 115C-37.1. For the purposes of that section, the Newton-Conover City Board of Education shall be considered a county board of education. 47" 48 49 SECTION 3.(b) This act does not affect the term of office of any member elected in 50 2019 or 2021 to the Newton-Conover City Board of Education. The members of the 51 Newton-Conover City Board of Education elected in 2019 and 2021, or any member appointed

2	shall serve until a successor has been elected and qualified. Any vacancy on the Newton-Conover

5	SECTION 3.(c) This section is effective when it becomes law and applies to		
6	elections held in 2023 and thereafter.		
7	SECTION 4.(a) G.S. 115C-37.1(d) reads as rewritten:		
8	"(d) This section shall apply only to the Hickory City Board of Education and the		
9	Newton-Conover City Board of Education and in the following counties: Alleghany, Beaufort,		
10	Brunswick, Burke, Caldwell, Carteret, Cherokee, Clay, Craven, Dare, Davie, Graham, Guilford,		
11	Harnett, Hyde, Iredell, Lee, Lincoln, Madison, New Hanover, Onslow, Pender, Rutherford,		
12	Stanly, Stokes, Surry, Vance, Washington, and Yancey."		
13	SECTION 4.(b) This section becomes effective December 1, 2023.		
14	SECTION 5.(a) G.S. 115C-37.1(d), as amended by Section 4 of this act, reads as		
15	rewritten:		
16	"(d) This section shall apply only to the Hickory City Board of Education and the		
17	Newton-Conover City Board of Education and in the following counties: Alleghany, Beaufort,		
18	Brunswick, Burke, Caldwell, Carteret, Catawba, Cherokee, Clay, Cleveland, Craven, Dare,		
19	Davie, Graham, Guilford, Harnett, Hyde, Iredell, Lee, Lincoln, Madison, New Hanover, Onslow,		
20	Pender, Rutherford, Stanly, Stokes, Surry, Vance, Washington, and Yancey."		
21	SECTION 5.(b) This section becomes effective December 1, 2024.		
22	SECTION 6. Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes		
23	law.
