Giving of blood by persons 16 years of age or more. 8 A person who is 16 or 17 years of age may give or donate blood to an individual, 9 hospital, blood bank, or blood collection center with the written consent of the parent or parents or guardian of the donor. 10 A person who is 16-18 years of age or more may give or donate blood to an individual, 11 (b) hospital, blood bank or blood collection center without the consent of the parent or parents or 12 guardian of the donor. 13 14 It shall be is unlawful for a person under the age of 18 years to sell blood." **SECTION 2.(d)** Effective October 1, 2023, G.S. 90-178.4 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:
