<u>(a)</u> <u>D</u>	Definition For purposes of this section, the term (i) "dangerous weapo	<u>n" is as</u>
defined in G.S. 14-277.2 and (ii) "voting place" is as defined in G.S. 163-165.		
<u>(b)</u> P	rohibition Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, it	shall be
unlawful for	any person to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, any dangerous	weapon
(i) at a location used as a voting place, (ii) within 100 feet from the door of entrance to a location		
used as a voting place, or (iii) while in line to vote at a location used as a voting place. The		
prohibition set forth in this subsection only applies while the location is open and being used as		
a voting place.		
<u>(c)</u> P	unishment. – Any person who violates the prohibition set forth in subsection	on (b) of
this section is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.		
<u>(d)</u> <u>E</u>	Exception. – The prohibition in subsection (b) of this section does not apply	to a law
enforcement officer acting in discharge of the officer's official duties."
