4	SECTION 1. The Department of Public Instruction, in consultation with the			
5	Department of Health and Human Services, the North Carolina School Boards Association, the			
6	North Carolina Association of School Administrators, the University of North Carolina School			
7	of Public Health, and the University of North Carolina School of Education, shall study cell			
8	phone policies in public elementary and secondary schools. The Department shall contact the			
9	governing bodies of public school units to collect and then analyze the following information:			
10	(1) Whether the policy is implemented by the governing board	of the public		
11	school unit or at the individual school level.			
12	(2) What the cell phone policy is, and specifically if the school us	ses any of the		
13	following policies:			
14	a. Complete ban on cell phone use or possession at school			
15	b. Storage of cell phones in a secure location during the inst	ructional day.		
16	c. No cell phone restrictions.			
17	(3) The impact of the policy on learning.			
18	(4) The impact of the policy on cyberbullying.			
19	(5) The impact of the policy on school safety.			
20	(6) Any other information the Department or consultant agencies	deem relevant		
21	to the study.
