enable an individual to recognize when information is needed and to locate, evaluate, and use the		
needed information effectively. Informational literacy includes, but is not limited to, digital,		
visual, media, textual, and technological literacy.		
	The State Board of Education shall adopt standards for age-appropriate instruction	
informational literacy for kindergarten through grade 12. The standards shall include at least the		
<u>following:</u>		
	1) The research process and how information is created and reproduced.	
	2) <u>Critical thinking skills and how to use information resources.</u>	
<u>(`.</u>	3) Methods of research, including the difference between primary and second	<u>ıdary</u>
	sources.	
	The differences between facts, points of view, and opinions.	
	5) How to access peer-reviewed print and digital library resources.

(c) Local school administrative units shall consult with library/media personnel when		
developing curriculum for the informational literacy standards."		
<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with		
the 2024-2025 school year.
