31	(1)	Establish a definition of primary care to be utilized by the Task Force. This			
32		term should be applicable to services and care provided under the NC			
33		Medicaid program, the State Health Plan, and commercial insurance.			
34	(2)	Conduct an actuarial evaluation of the current healthcare spend on primary			
35		care services, both as it relates to the NC Medicaid program and the			
36		commercial market, including Medicare Advantage plans.
