2	requirements of the insurer related to the service or procedure.
3	(c) Insurers offering a health benefit plan in this State that delegate credentialing
4	agreements to contracted health care facilities shall accept credentialing for pharmacists
5	employed or contracted with those facilities.
6	(d) Insurers offering a health benefit plan in this State shall reimburse a contracted health
7	care facility or a contracted pharmacist directly for covered services performed by a pharmacist
8	within that pharmacist's lawful scope of practice whether or not the pharmacist is a participating
9	provider in the insurer's provider network.
10	(e) The participation of a pharmacy in a drug benefit provider network of an insurer
11	offering a health benefit plan in this State shall not satisfy any requirement that insurers offering
12	health benefit plans include pharmacists in medical benefit provider networks.
13	(f) This section shall also apply to the following:
14	(1) Agents of an insurer offering a health benefit plan in this State.
15	(2) Third-party administrators, as defined under G.S. 58-56-2."
16	SECTION 2.(b) This section becomes effective October 1, 2023, and applies to
17	contracts entered into, renewed, or amended on or after that date.
18	SECTION 3.(a) The North Carolina Medical Board and the North Carolina Board
19	of Pharmacy shall adopt temporary rules to implement the provisions of this act.
20	SECTION 3.(b) This section is effective when it becomes law.
21	SECTION 4. Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective October 1,
22	2023.
