Rules adopted pursuant to this section are not subject 25 to Part 3 of Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General Statutes and shall become effective as 26 provided in G.S. 150B-21.3(b1) as though 10 or more written objections had been received as 27 provided by G.S. 150B-21.3(b2). 28

SECTION 2. Transitional Provisions. – Radon proficiency programs currently operating and were included in public listings of programs by the Department at any time after January 1, 2020, shall be deemed to be an approved radon proficiency program under this act until the Commission has adopted permanent rules under Section 1 of this act and has approved or denied approval of the program under those rules.

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
