A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ALLOW ADDITIONAL SALES OF NATURAL, UNPASTEURIZED MILK.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. G.S. 106-266.35 reads as rewritten:

"§ 106-266.35. Sale or dispensing of milk.

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section:
 - Only milk that is Grade "A" pasteurized milk may be sold or dispensed directly to consumers for human consumption.
 - (2) Raw milk and raw milk products shall be sold or dispensed only to a permitted milk hauler or to a processing facility at which the processing of milk is permitted, graded, or regulated by a local, State, or federal agency.
- (b) The Board of Agriculture may adopt rules to provide exceptions for dispensing raw milk and raw milk products for nonhuman consumption. Any raw milk or raw milk product dispensed as animal feed shall include on its label the statement "NOT FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION" in letters at least one-half inch in height. Any raw milk or raw milk product dispensed as animal feed shall also include on its label the statement "IT IS NOT LEGAL TO SELL RAW MILK FOR HUMAN CONSUMPTION IN NORTH CAROLINA." This labeling requirement does not apply to raw milk or raw milk products dispensed for personal use or consumption to the independent or partial owner of a cow, goat, or other lactating animal.
- (c) As used in this section, the term "sale" or "sold" means any transaction that involves the transfer or dispensing of milk and milk products or the right to acquire milk and milk products through barter or contractual arrangement or in exchange for any other form of compensation. The term "sale" or "sold" does not include the transfer or dispensing of raw milk or raw milk products to, or the right to acquire raw milk or raw milk products by, the independent or partial owner of a cow, goat, or other lactating animal.
- (d) Nothing in this section shall prohibit the dispensing of raw milk or raw milk products for personal use or consumption to, or the under the following circumstances:
 - (1) The acquisition of raw milk or raw milk products for personal use or consumption by, by an independent or partial owner of a cow, goat, or other lactating animal.
 - (2) Sale of grade "A" raw milk, cream, and raw milk products as set forth in G.S. 106-266.35A."
- **SECTION 2.** Article 28C of Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read:



1 "§ 106-266.35A. Retail sale of raw milk and raw milk products. 2 The following definitions apply in this section: (a) 3 <u>Department. – The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.</u> (1) 4 Eligible farmer. – The owner or operator of a farm producing raw milk or raw (2) 5 milk products. 6 Farm of origin. – The farm where the raw milk or raw milk product was bottled <u>(3)</u> 7 or created and placed in containers. 8 Farm stand. – A structure used for the display and sale of dairy products and <u>(4)</u> 9 other farm commodities that is no more than 1,000 square feet in size and 10 which offers for sale to the public dairy products and agricultural commodities 11 grown or produced by the owner or operator of the farm stand. On the farm. – With respect to the location of permissible sales of raw milk 12 <u>(5)</u> 13 and raw milk products, at the farm of origin or at a farm stand owned or 14 operated by the owner of that farm in a different location in this State within 100 miles of the farm of origin. This term does not include a restaurant, snack 15 bar, soda fountain, or similar establishment selling prepared foods to the 16 17 public. Raw milk license. - A license issued by the Department to the owner or 18 <u>(6)</u> 19 operator of a farm that allows the sale or dispensing of raw milk and raw milk 20 products to consumers for personal use or consumption on the farm. 21 (7) Raw milk product. – Cream, cottage cheese, buttermilk, butter, kefir, and other cheeses made from grade "A" raw milk. 22 23 The Department may issue a raw milk license for a period not to exceed one year and 24 subsequent license renewals for a like term to an eligible party if the following conditions are 25 met: 26 <u>(1)</u> The Department inspects the farm owned or operated by the eligible farmer 27 and determines that the farm is in compliance with the applicable provisions 28 of this Article and all other federal and State requirements applicable to grade 29 "A" milk with the exception of a requirement for pasteurization. 30 **(2)** The eligible farmer provides confirmation in a form and manner as the 31 Department may specify that all cows used in the production of raw milk sold 32 under this section or used for the production of raw milk products sold 33 pursuant to this section are free from tuberculosis and brucellosis. This 34 confirmation must be repeated annually. 35 The eligible farmer provides the Department a copy of the report from an <u>(3)</u> 36 annual veterinary examination report. The report must reflect that, upon 37 physical examination, the subject animals are in apparent good health and free 38 from evidence of communicable disease. The veterinary examination must be 39 repeated annually. 40 Unless the farm obtains water through a public or municipal water system, the <u>(4)</u> 41 eligible farmer has the farm water supply tested and provides the Department 42 with confirmation that the water is bacteriologically safe. The water testing 43 must be repeated every six months. The requirement of a bacteriologically 44 safe water supply is also applicable to recirculated cooling water if the dairy 45 farm uses a recirculated cooling water system for milk cooling. 46 (5) The eligible farmer agrees to comply with regular sampling and testing 47 requirements of raw milk samples. Samples must be analyzed at a laboratory 48 approved by the Department and comply with the following standards: Raw milk shall be cooled to 40°F (4°C) or less within two hours after 49 a.

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milking, provided that the blend temperature after the first and

subsequent milking does not exceed 50°F (10°C).

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective January 1, 2026.

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
