A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE ASIAN AMERICAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER HERITAGE COMMISSION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL AND CULTURAL RESOURCES AND TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO SUPPORT THE COMMISSION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. Article 2 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is amended by adding			
a new Part to read:

<u>Upon the expiration of the terms of the initial Commission members, each member shall be appointed for a three-year term and shall serve until a successor is appointed.</u>

- (c) <u>Vacancies. A vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment, except that all unexpired terms appointed by the General Assembly shall be filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Appointees to fill vacancies shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term and until their successors have been duly appointed and qualified.</u>
- (d) Removal. The Commission may remove any of its members for neglect of duty, incompetence, or unprofessional conduct. A member subject to disciplinary proceedings shall be disqualified from participating in the official business of the Commission until the charges have been resolved.
- (e) Officers. The chair shall be designated by the Governor from among the members of the Commission to serve as chair at the pleasure of the Governor. The Commission shall elect annually from its membership a vice-chair and other officers deemed necessary by the Commission to carry out the purposes of this Article.
- (f) Meetings; Quorum. The Commission shall meet at least semiannually to conduct business. The Board shall establish the procedures for calling, holding, and conducting regular and special meetings. A majority of Commission members shall constitute a quorum.
- (g) <u>Compensation. The Commission members shall receive no salary as a result of serving on the Commission but shall receive per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 120-3.1, 138-5, and 138-6, as applicable."</u>
- **SECTION 2.** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in recurring funds for each year of the 2025-2027 fiscal biennium to support the operations of the Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Commission, including a director and an associate director, established in Section 1 of this act. The Department of Natural and Cultural Resources shall provide necessary clerical and administrative support services to the Commission.

SECTION 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 2025.
