 - (7) Administrative specialists employed by or retired from the Department of Public Safety or any of its subdivisions.
 - (8) <u>Various licensees of the Private Protective Services Board.</u>
 - (9) Various trained forensic specialists.
 - (10) Trained diagnostic radiologic technologists.
 - (c) Oversight. The Director of the Division shall oversee the organization of DMORT and coordinate the development and updating of a response plan utilizing DMORT's primary objectives. The Director shall integrate DMORT into the North Carolina Emergency Operations Plan for disaster response and recovery.
 - (d) Expenses. Within available appropriations, the Division shall spend the necessary funds for training, equipment, and other items necessary to support the operations of DMORT. The Division may also administer any grants of other funds made available for DMORT, in accordance with applicable rules and regulations approved by the Director of the State Budget.
 - (e) <u>Training.</u> The Division shall coordinate with DMORT for periodic training for membership in DMORT for each team member and coordinate with the appropriate State agencies and organizations, including the North Carolina Board of Funeral Service, the Medical Care Commission, the Department of Health and Human Services, local emergency management departments, first responder associations and organizations, and any other State agency or organization the Division deems appropriate.

"§ 166A-73. Specialized operations; transportation services.

- (a) Specialized Operations. DMORT shall specialize in the following operations when responding to a disaster:
 - (1) Tracking and documenting human remains and personal effects.
 - (2) Establishing temporary morgue facilities.
 - (3) Assisting in the determination of cause and manner of death.
 - (4) Collecting ante-mortem data.
 - (5) Collection of medical records, dental records, or DNA of victims from next of kin to assist in victim identification.
 - (6) Performing postmortem data collection.
 - (7) Documentation during field retrieval and morgue operations.
 - (8) Performing forensic dental pathology and forensic anthropology methods.
 - (9) Preparing, processing, and returning human remains and personal effects to appropriate recipients.
 - (10) Processing and re-internment of disinterred remains.
 - (11) Providing technical assistance and consultation on fatality management and mortuary affairs.
- (b) Transportation Services. DMORT shall provide transportation services for the returning of victims to counties of residence and family members for proper burial or cremation. Any transportation service rendered after a disaster shall make all reasonable attempts to comply with State and local law and Board rules when transporting human remains within the emergency area in the State. Once the transportation of the human remains is outside the emergency area, DMORT shall comply with all State and local laws and Board rules.

"§ 166A-74. Immunity.

Members of DMORT shall be protected from liability under the provisions of G.S. 166A-19.60(a) while active on DMORT missions pursuant to authorization from the Division."

SECTION 2. The Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, and the North Carolina Board of Funeral Service may adopt rules to implement the

- provisions of this act. Both the Division and the Board shall coordinate in rulemaking to implement this act.
- 3 **SECTION 3.** Section 1 of this act becomes effective October 1, 2025. The remainder of this act is effective when it becomes law.
